Motown Winter Blast

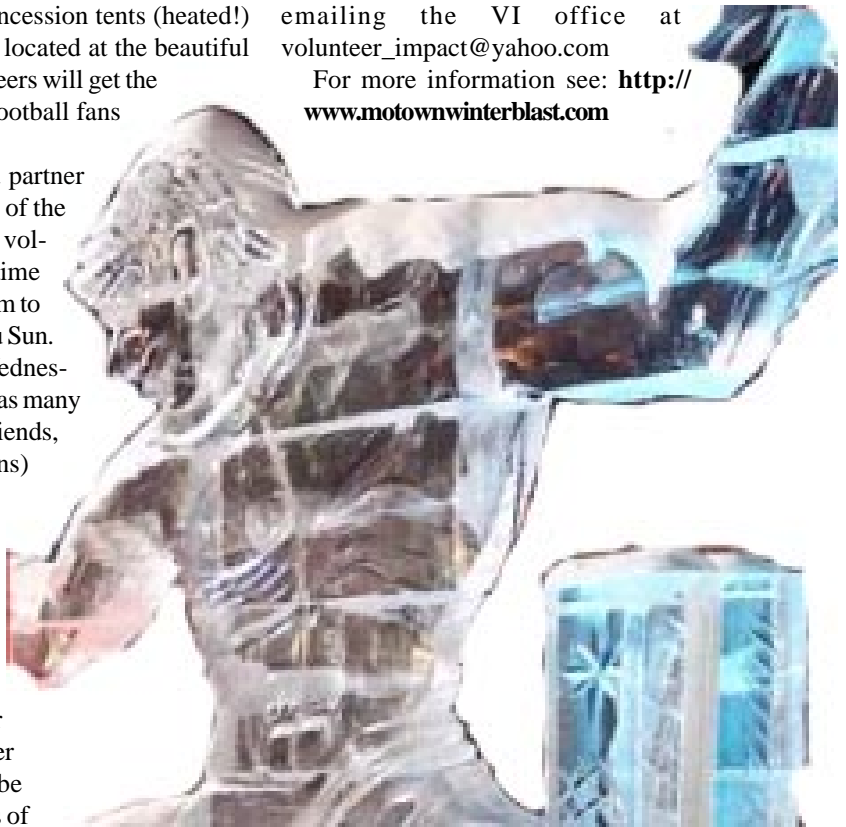
Be a Part of Superbowl Week

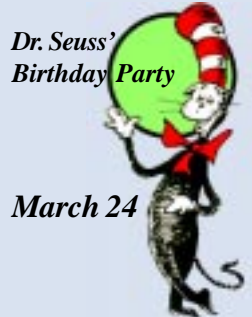

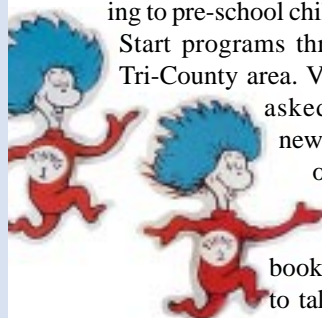

When most 11-year-old girls are asked what they want to do for their birthday, dreams of sleepover parties, lots of presents, and perhaps N'Sync stopping by to give their best wishes usually come to the fore. But one Metro-Detroit young lady decided she would much rather use the focus on her special day to help those more in need.

Huntington Woods mother Chris Gross was impressed with her daughter's idea and contacted VI for suggestions as to what they could do. "I was so pleased with how enthusiastic the girls and their parents were about the party," said Gross. "We made blankets for foster children through the mitzvah project sponsored by the National Council for Jewish Women. We also made cookies to be served at the South Oakland Shelter and gathered donated goods re-



quested by the Shelter. The girls took charge at the party, and I was able to sit back and let them lead the way."

The girls were able to make 10 baby/kid blankets for the council to provide to children when they are placed in foster homes.

Mitten Making Magic

VI Teens Find One Yard of Fleece Goes a Long Way

Chelsey Spriggs, a Volunteer Impact Youth Board member, and President and Founder of Kids In Service to Society (K.I.S.S.) says, "Homelessness is a lot like an onion. Every time you peel back another layer of the problem, it makes you want to cry a little more." There are approximately 12,000 homeless people in Detroit, and about 25% or roughly 3,000 of them are teens, aged 13 to 17.

The K.I.S.S. girls, all honor students at Renaissance High School, decided to help them by making hundreds of mittens and scarves out of fleece this winter.

The project, called "Mitten Making Madness," was adopted by the Volunteer Impact Youth Board and the Detroit Urban League College Club. Metropolitan Church of God in Detroit provided a donation of \$350 for the purchase of fleece, and opened its doors to sewing parties where volunteers helped cut out and sew dozens of mittens.

The mittens were the brainchild of Carolyn Spriggs, Chelsey's mother and VI member, who serves as a co-chair of the youth board. The students met at several locations throughout the month under Spriggs' supervision.

On December 3, the group shared 20 sets of the mittens and scarves at the Adopt-A-Shelter event at Booth Evangeline
