Volunteers filled an entire dumpster with debris by noon.

The best part of the whole day was the reawakening of pride by the neighbors of Grandale. One man, whose well-kept house is across the street, was inspired by our volunteers (and the beautiful weather) to paint his curb. Another neighbor took out his lawn mower. After he cut his grass, he started on the empty lots across from him and next to him. This was the true goal of this day. And I'm pleased and proud to say that our volunteer efforts worked!

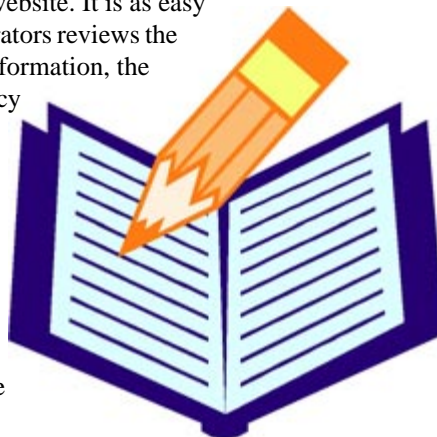


## Agency Coordinators - Take Control

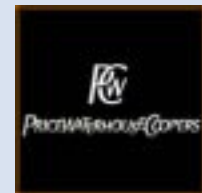
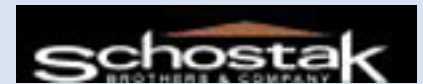
Agencies will have an easier time adding projects to our calendar. All it takes is e-mail to Volunteer Impact –one time– and you can add projects as you need them.

E-mail us at [volunteer\\_impact@yahoo.com](mailto:volunteer_impact@yahoo.com) and give us the information for your agency's volunteer coordinator. You will receive the status of "agency coordinator" and you will be able to enter projects on the Volunteer Impact website. It is as easy as filling out a form. Once our website administrators reviews the project to be sure we have all of the relevant information, the project will be entered on our calendar. If the agency coordinator or someone else from your agency will act as the project coordinator (PC), the person who will interact with the VI volunteers, VI will identify that person as a PC. The PC can print out the website for the names, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses of the volunteers for your project. The list even prints out in the form of a sign-in sheet for the date of the project.

Volunteer Impact just updated its website to make volunteering and donating easier. When you go to our home page, you'll immediately see the list of volunteer events and announcements on the right side of the page. In addition, if you have an account, when you log on, you will receive announcements which merit your attention.

Your profile will now include your cell and home phone numbers so that we can contact you with last minute information. It makes it a lot easier for our project coordinator to reach you if the project is canceled due to a snowstorm, or for some other important reason. This information will not be used for anything other than contacting you with information about the project.

As mentioned elsewhere in this issue,

agencies can now log on and enter projects at their convenience. And project coordinators can print list of volunteers for their projects anytime.

Tributes are easier now and you can make tributes in honor of or in memory of someone on line. Simply provide the information in the on-line form, pay with your credit card and VI will send out a tribute card.

Many of the changes are visible only to those of us who administer the website each day. We hope these upgrades will make your volunteer experience easier and more enjoyable.
