Red Cross Disaster Preparedness, Sept. 8-9

On Sept. 8-9, 2006, there will be a major disaster readiness exercise in Southwest Detroit involving a simulated weapon of mass destruction scenario.

1000 people will have the opportunity to help their community as Red Cross volunteers.

We need hundreds of volunteers to make this event a success so no group is too large! Volunteers can visit our website www.semredcross.org and click on the Exercise button (on the left side) to register.

There are three volunteer options. Orientation and meals are provided:

Evacuee - This volunteer position will take place on Friday, September 8, 2006. These volunteers will arrive at Western High School at 4pm. They will go through volunteer registration to prepare them to participate in the event. A bus will transport them to an emergency reception center where our community emergency management agencies will test their intake process. They will be returned to Western High School where they can depart around 9pm. Evacuees should expect to spend about 5 hours participating in this position.

Decon - This volunteer position will take place on Friday, September 8, 2006. Community members who wish to serve as "decon" volunteers will help our hospitals and fire departments test their decontamination systems. In the event that a bomb or some other chemical is released in our environment, these agencies would be charged with decontaminating community members. Decon volunteers will give them the opportunity to practice these skills. Decon volunteers will report to Western High School at 4pm to go through volunteer registration. Once the event begins, they will be transported to a local hospital to be "decontaminated". When this process is complete, they will be transported back to Western High School where they can depart around 9pm. To facilitate participation in this event, volunteers will need to wear a swimsuit or like clothing under their street clothes. This volunteer opportunity will require them to get wet. Decon



volunteers should expect to spend about 5 hours participating in this position (4-9pm).

Shelter Volunteer - This volunteer position will begin on Friday, September 8, 2006 and end on Saturday, September 9, 2006. These volunteers will begin their volunteer service as Evacuee volunteers. Please read the information above for that position. However, instead of being transported back to Western High around 9pm, Shelter volunteers will stay at the American Red Cross shelter overnight. While many of the logistical details will be like they would be in a real sheltering environment, we will have events to keep volunteers involved throughout the evening. Once registered as a shelter volunteer on the evening of Friday, September 8th, volunteers will be asked not to leave the shelter until mid-morning on Saturday, September 9th. Volunteers should expect to spend about 18 hours participating in this opportunity. Volunteers interested in staying in the overnight shelter will need to complete additional information prior to the exercise. We will contact them to fill out these forms once we receive their confirmed registration.

Book preview party to benefit Volunteer Impact's 'Time to Help'



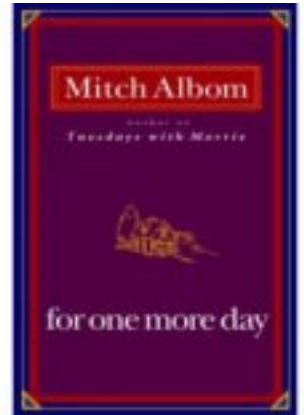
